Chilly 1/2 Marathon & Frosty 5K Partial Road Closures

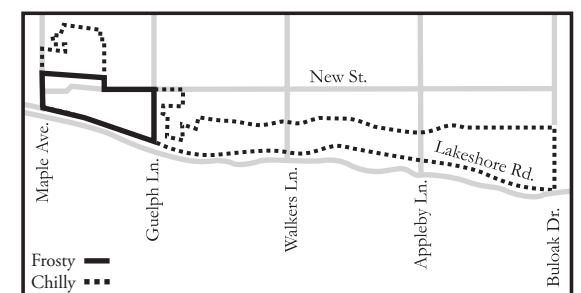
The City of Burlington welcomes you to enjoy Special Events and Festivals throughout the year in the Downtown. Partial road closures to accommodate the Chilly 1/2 Marathon & Frosty 5K, supervised by Halton Regional Police, will take place on **Sunday, March 5th 2006**.

The roadways highlighted on the map below will be under partial road closure conditions at various times between **8 a.m. to 1 p.m.** on the day of the event.

If you plan to attend the event as a participant or spectator, please OBEY all signs and park legally to ensure that emergency response vehicles have access to all roadways. Illegally parked vehicles will be subject to tickets and/or tows. **Parking will be available at the Multi-Use Parking facility - 414 Locust Street (Parking Garage).**

Please note that there will be a very short, police supervised detour to traffic travelling east to west on Lakeshore Road. This detour will divert traffic to Old Lakeshore Road (Between Pearl St. & Torrance St.) for approximately 200 meters.
